Capital Area New Mainers – It's Not Too Late

Emergency Funds needed to aid families affected by ICE detention

UUCC was privileged to have Jon Godbout, Executive Director of Capital Area New Mainers Project (CANMP) as a guest in our pulpit on July 27. Jon spoke of an asylum seeker living in Augusta that is being detained in Ohio. The man was stopped by the police while driving for no other discernable reason than the color of his skin. Because he was driving with an international license, the police called ICE. Our neighbor is now in a detention center in Ohio; he and his wife are expecting a baby in September. He has been granted status as an asylee but still detained; the U.S. government's lawyer asked for 30 days to appeal the judge's decision.

In the latest CANMP Newsletter, Jon writes of 2 other families who have had loved ones detained by ICE. CANMP is helping each of these individuals by paying the costs of some legal fees and translations of legal documents; CANMP is helping each of the impacted families with emergency needs.

CANMP was the recipient of the July Share the Plate. The money collected went to an emergency fund to help individuals and families impacted by ICE detention and the threat of deportation. It is not too late to donate to the CANMP Emergency Fund. Instructions for donations are on the website https://www.newmainersproject.org/ under the tab "Get Involved."

Capital Area Interfaith Social Justice Coalition is sponsoring a community educational event explaining the immigration system and the perils for our new neighbors seeking asylum and permanent status. Speakers will include Jon Godbout, Executive Director of the Capital Area New Mainers Project in Kennebec County and Lisa Parisio, an immigration attorney with the Immigrant Legal Advocacy Project in Portland. This information session will be held at Lithgow Library in Augusta, September 16, 5:30-6:30.

Pastoral Care Team Opening and Update for Ride & Meal Coordinator

There is an opportunity to assist coordinating rides and meals for UUCCers. If you have questions about this role or would like to fill the coordination position for rides and meals, please contact Martha Pelletier or Rev. Donna Dolham.

In September, if this position is not filled, UUCC will not be able to accept new requests for transportation or meal assistance. This ministry is intended to meet short term needs of those in our community.

The pastoral care team will continue to support the community through lay visiting, pastoral listening and supportive outreach.

Covenant Engagement Team

As we approach the beginning of our new church year with Ingathering Sunday, it's a great time to continue our practice of keeping our Covenant alive and thereby protect and nourish our relationships with each other. If you took our May workshop, "How to Say Hard Things", you might like more practice using the Brave Model: name the harm; invite the common value; offer help. Or you may just want to explore what's the best thing to do when you see or hear something that seems to challenge our Covenant.

Here's a situation to ponder: You are in a church committee meeting. After the chalice lighting, a reading, and a check-in, the first task is to approve the minutes of the last meeting.

Before there is much discussion, Person A turns to Person B (sitting next to each other) and whispers but loud enough for others to hear: "Did you notice that, as usual, I didn't get credit for the suggestion adopted at our last meeting. I think she's [referring to the Committee's secretary] just jealous of me."

How would you respond to one of more of the following prompts?

- 1. Imagine you are the Committee's secretary, what would you do or say -- and when?
- 2. Now imagine you are Person B and the Secretary doesn't say or do anything. What would you do or say -- and when?
- 3. What if you were the Chair of that Committee?
- 4. Would it make a difference if you had an informal agreement (or even a committee covenant) about not engaging in "side" conversations? If so, how?

Tired of Drafty Windows?

WindowDressers can Help!

Do you or someone you know live in a home with windows that let heat escape in the winter? WindowDressers is a nonprofit organization that supports volunteers in constructing lightweight insulating window inserts that fit inside a home's existing windows to let in all the sunlight while keeping in more heat. Not only do inserts make rooms warmer, they lower heating costs and reduce carbon pollution. Inserts are built by volunteers at local "Community Builds". This construction model keeps insert costs low for all, and free for anyone experiencing financial hardship.

This October, the Conservation Commissions of Hallowell, Augusta, and Manchester are partnering to host a Community Build at the Buker Community Center in Augusta. The deadline for having windows custom-measured by volunteers is early September, so interested folks should request inserts soon at WindowDressers.org. A Call for Donations to the Augusta Food Bank

Fellow friends and members of UUCC,

Although the holidays are still a few more months away, a time when the need to help families suffering from food insecurity seems to be right in front of us, I urge you to recognize that given the climate we currently find ourselves in begs the question," can we wait"?

A couple months ago, and with the blessings of the Social Justice Committee, I delivered an announcement after the service via the Worship Associate to draw your attention to the rather humble Augusta Food Bank "donation box" on the floor in our coat room. I made the promise that, as a Food Bank volunteer, I would deliver your donations to the Food Bank every Tuesday. Thank you for all who responded so generously.

But as I outlined above, we are again at a critical point. As I believe we are all painfully aware of, the new federal budget bill, adopted on May 22nd, will critically impact our vulnerable neighbors in need, including more and more of those we call "us".

Those experiencing food insecurity will be hit hard. The SNAP program will now require states to partially pay for SNAP benefits in addition to covering more administrative costs. All the funding for the SNAP program has now been relegated to the states.

I imagine most of us focus on how losing crucial food assistance impacts families with children, but additionally AARP has highlighted how it is also going to be devastating for seniors stating, "About 12.6 million adults ages 50 and older have limited access to nutritious food because of financial constraints. They are often hungry, cutting back on or skipping meals because they can't afford groceries."

I don't have the numbers in front of me, but I know that our clients at the Food Bank have increased exponentially, especially on Free Food Thursday when no residency requirements are in place.

So here I am again my friends. Serving the hungry cries out in service to so many of the communities that we attempt to protect and respect: the immigrant communities, the unhoused communities, the community of people with disabilities and our elders. I am so fulfilled to be able to do this work, *but this is not about me*. This is about us creating Beloved Community and this is one of the ways we can do that.

So, if you are still one of the fortunate members of our congregation who can donate canned vegetables or fruit, cereal, dried pasta and gluten free products you know where the donation box is. I check it every time I am in the sanctuary.

But, lastly, if **your** situation has changed given so many painful and Draconian cuts, I would be more than pleased to be a bridge for you, of course all in confidence and I help you join as a client. No one should ever go hungry.

What is MUUSAN?

The Maine Unitarian Universalist State Advocacy Network (MUUSAN) is a statewide advocacy and public policy network anchored in our Unitarian Universalist faith and animated by its principles. The legislative ministry links Maine's 26 Unitarian Universalist congregations to promote just, humane laws and policies in keeping with our UUA Principles. We welcome as partners and collaborators all those who share our values.

In 2012, Maine became the 17th state to create a State Advocacy Network. At work today in 25 states, SANs are the fastest-growing arm of Unitarian Universitism nationwide, and for good reason.

UU congregations and individuals are creating Advocacy Networks, including MUUSAN, because they realize that, vital as they are, worship services, good works, and study groups are not enough. In a denomination that is characterized by social activism, we are called to bring our values to bear in the public arena: in the State Legislature, the news media, the development of policy, and the pursuit of justice.

Board of Trustees
