The Covenant Engagement Team (CET)

Our Covenant Promise for June is: "Because we value our relationships with each other, we promise to: Take responsibility for our own words and actions and explore differences openly, directly, and with compassion while assuming the good intentions of one another."

What a wonderful promise with which to wind up our regular church year! One of the main points here is to be both open <u>and</u> direct with each other. Here's one model for being direct when an issue comes up:

- 1. Speak directly to the person involved; or
- 2. If speaking directly is too difficult, ask someone to come with you (as a support person) and both go directly to the person involved; or
- 3. If speaking directly to the other person is too difficult, ask someone to use your name when they bring your issue to that other person .

Notice that "anonymous" feedback or talking behind someone's back is not part of this model. This is also a wonderful opportunity to practice the BRAVE model we learned in our May workshop on How To Say Hard Things.

How often, however, do we explore an issue not directly, but by "venting" to someone else? There are times, of course, where getting another viewpoint about something is helpful when sorting out one's own strong emotions. Part of "assuming good intentions" is to be willing to listen while someone sorts through a problem. HOWEVER, just listening is not where it should end.

As the "listener" we might use the BRAVE model and say: "I am noticing that you're really upset about what "X" did [or said]." (**Step 1 Share by naming the harm**.)

I am certainly willing to help you sort through your feelings, as long as we abide by our Covenant, which asks us to be direct with each other." (Step 2: Ground by naming shared values.)

"Once you are clear about both the harm and your feelings, I would feel more comfortable if you had a plan to discuss this with X." (Step 3: Inviting an action that leads to repair.). That plan may be to write things out so the speaker is clear; or to volunteer to go with them when they speak to "X"; or to go to X yourself and discuss the issue while being clear who is having the difficulty.

Opportunities for deeper connection by serving in the following (now vacant) volunteer positions:

New Sunday Coffee Hour Organizer

This volunteer position is primarily on email and possibly using a spread sheet. With help from someone on Global Hospitality, groups of 4 individuals with one of them a leader will be organized for each Sunday. There is some shuffling after the emails are sent out.

We have been operating in this manner for a year now, so members are aware of the system. Feedback was primarily positive to this new system. Interested in serving in this capacity or need more information, please contact Susan O'Keefe, Global Hospitality.

New Pastoral Care Volunteer Opportunity: Lead Person to Coordinate Rides and Meals

The UUCC Pastoral Ministry Team (PMT) has for many years offered meals and local rides to members and friends as needed. The person who has been organizing these services is stepping down from that role in June. Our team is seeking an organized person to "carry the torch" and ensure these services continue.

The work entails responding to rides and meals requests by consulting the PMT volunteer database and contacting those who may be most able to help with each request. Volunteers have indicated on the database which services they are offering. The Rides and Meals Coordinator will become a member of the Pastoral Ministry Team and will be collaborating with the Team at monthly PMT meetings on Zoom.



June is Gun Violence Prevention Awareness Month, and there's a big way you can make a difference. With only a few weeks left in the legislative session, law-makers will be voting on hundreds of bills and we need your help to make sure that they pass life-saving gun safety legislation this year.



We need gun safety advocates in the halls of the State House talking to legislators about our gun safety priorities as before the legislative session on Tuesdays,

Wednesdays, and Thursdays for the first two weeks of June. Can you sign up today for the days you're available

to help?

SIGN UP HERE

Our main focus will be on our top three legislative priorities: ghost gun serialization, secure storage re-quirements, and a bump stock ban.

Session is scheduled to begin each day at 10 AM, so we will need supporters on the Third Floor of the State House by 9:15 AM with plans to stay until 11 AM. If possible, please come dressed in orange or otherwise identify yourself as a gun safety advocate.

We will be reaching out to everyone who signs up with more information on what to expect and to distribute talking points.

This June, let's use our voices and actions to pass laws that will save lives in Maine. Please join us!

ALL HANDS ON DECK!!

We need each one of you to **contact your state legislators IMMEDIATELY** to let them know you want them **to oppose the anti-trans bills** coming up for floor debate and votes in Augusta very soon.

The bills are coming out of the Judiciary Committee with "divided reports" (all the Democrats voted "ought <u>not</u> to pass"—except for Dani O'Halloran of Brewer who voted in favor, and Adam Lee of Auburn who had to abstain on the school-related bills because his law firm represents the Maine Principals Association—and a majority of Republicans voted in favor on all but the bill that proposes to remove gender identity as a protected class in the Maine Human Rights Act).

Those divided reports mean **the bills will be debated on the floor** of one or both chambers **before votes are cast**. (The date hasn't been announced yet, but it will be soon.)

No matter where you live, it's time to contact your state representative and state senator NOW.

Be sure to mention you are a constituent and a person of faith and respectfully explain your reasons for wanting them to <u>oppose</u> these harmful bills and VOTE NO.

If you don't know how to contact your state legislators or even who they are, it's easy to find out! Click <u>HERE</u>, enter your street address and town, then choose the "Elected Officials" tab on the page that pops up. You will see your legislators' names, email addresses, and sometimes even their phone numbers.

Even if you already know your legislators will be opposing the bills, *contact them anyway* to thank them and assure them you have their back.
